

Ruhr University Bochum (RUB) is one of the leading research universities in Germany. As a reform-oriented campus university, it uniquely combines the entire spectrum of the major scientific disciplines. The dynamic coexistence of subjects and subject cultures offers researchers as well as students special opportunities for interdisciplinary cooperation.

The University Hospital of Ruhr University Bochum (UK RUB) is made up of qualified hospitals and specialist medical facilities in the Bochum, Herne and Ostwestfalen-Lippe region that cooperate with Ruhr-University. The UK RUB stands for medical care at the highest level and excellent research and teaching in university medicine.

At St. Josef Hospital Bochum, the position of a

as Director of the Institute of Diagnostic and Interventional Radiology and Nuclear Medicine
(successor to Prof. Abolmaali)

is to be filled at the earliest possible time.

The spectrum of the Institute of Diagnostic and Interventional Radiology and Nuclear Medicine includes all diagnostic radiological procedures (3T & 1.5T MRI, MDCT, DSA with Dyna-CT, conventional X-ray diagnostics including fluoroscopy, sonography). Complete nuclear medicine diagnostics with SPECT and PET/CT as well as radiosynoviortheses are carried out. In addition to diagnostics, numerous interventional procedures are carried out; the focus is particularly on the interventional therapy of the oncology specialisation at St. Josef Hospital. Innovative therapeutic procedures such as selective internal radiotherapy (SIRT) and transarterial chemoembolisation (TACE) are used for the targeted and effective treatment of liver tumours. Additionally, the department specialises in vascular interventions (including aortic prostheses, CT-guided punctures - including pain therapy, abscess drainage, RFA) and works in close cooperation with the Department of Vascular Surgery for this purpose. Together with the Department of Neurology, there is proven expertise in the field of inflammatory brain diseases. Interventional cerebral procedures such as cerebral lyses and thrombectomies are carried out at the Institute of Neuroradiology, headed by Prof. Dr C. Lukas. There is very close co-operation between the two institutes in terms of infrastructure and staff. A high-performance radiology information system (RIS) with an integrated digital image archiving and distribution system (PACS) is part of the basic equipment. The department is integrated into the network for medical telecooperation - connectMT.

The scientific focus of the Institute of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine is on the field of diagnostic and therapeutic gastroenterological oncology in close cooperation with the Departments of Gastroenterology, Haematology/Oncology and Visceral Surgery.

The post holder will be expected to integrate into the Faculty's main research areas (oncology, neurosciences and protein sciences). Clinical scientific cooperation with institutions of the Faculty of Medicine and UK RUB in the existing research foci and development areas as well as participation in existing and future collaborative research projects are desired.

Applicants must have a positively evaluated junior professorship, habilitation or, alternatively, equivalent scientific achievements as well as a specialist qualification in radiology and nuclear medicine. In addition to outstanding scientific qualifications, successful acquisition of third-party funding and a willingness to participate in academic self-administration, the following are also required:

- Proof of particular aptitude for academic teaching and a high level of commitment to teaching
- a willingness to engage in interdisciplinary academic work
- the willingness and proven ability to acquire externally funded research projects

The appointment procedure is carried out by Ruhr University Bochum in agreement with Catholic Hospital Bochum as the sponsor of St. Josef Hospital. The appointment is made on the basis of an employment contract under private law. The connection to the university is in accordance with § 9 (2) HG NRW.

RUB and Catholic Hospital Bochum are committed to diversity and equal opportunities. We therefore promote the cooperation of heterogeneous teams and the career paths of people who are underrepresented in the respective fields of work. RUB expressly encourages applications from women. In areas where they are underrepresented, they will be given preferential consideration if they have the same qualifications. Applications from people with disabilities are also very welcome.
