Ruhr University Bochum (RUB) is one of the foremost research institutes in Germany. As a reformoriented campus university, it brings together the whole spectrum of major scientific disciplines in a unique way. Its dynamic interplay of faculties and specialist cultures offers exceptional opportunities for interdisciplinary collaboration to researchers and students alike.

The Ruhr University Bochum Clinical Complex (UK-RUB) is made up of qualified hospitals and specialist medical facilities that cooperate with Ruhr University in Bochum, Herne and East Westphalia-Lippe. The UK-RUB is synonymous with patient care at the highest level and excellent research and teaching in university medicine.

The Johannes Wesling Clinic Minden, Ruhr University Bochum (RUB) University Clinic, is currently seeking to appoint a

University Professor (analogous to W3) for Emergency Medicine as Director of the Institute of Anesthesiology, Intensive Care and Emergency Medicine (successor to Prof. Dr Jochen Hinkelbein)

The Johannes Wesling Clinic is one of the Mühlenkreis Clinics and, as a University Clinic of the Ruhr University Bochum, is responsible for the clinical component of medical studies in East Westphalia-Lippe along with other university departments in Lübbecke, Bad Oeynhausen and Herford under the umbrella of university medicine at Bochum.

The Mühlenkreis Clinics (Mühlenkreiskliniken AöR) treat around 200,000 patients a year at the Minden, Lübbecke, Rahden and Bad Oeynhausen sites. The Johannes Wesling Clinic has a total of 19 departments with inpatient capacity and five institutes.

Every year, over 17,000 patients, including around 300 children under the age of one, are supported through the entire anesthesia process. All modern anaesthetic procedures are practised, on patients ranging from newborns to the elderly. In the emergency medicine field, there are approximately 4,000 ambulance emergency response vehicle deployments per year. The institute is part of an interdisciplinary centre for intensive medicine. All modern intensive medicine procedures are in use.

The director of the institute is a specialist in anesthesiology with additional training in intensive care medicine, emergency medicine and clinical acute and emergency medicine. They represent the entire field of emergency medicine in research, teaching and patient care. In particular, they have extensive practical experience in clinical anesthesia, intensive care, palliative care, emergency medicine and pain therapy as well as in the management of an intensive care unit and an emergency medical centre.

The future post holder should represent the field of emergency medicine in research and teaching. The post holder will be expected to integrate into the faculty's main research areas (oncology, neurosciences and protein sciences) and demonstrate experience in leading research groups with a focus on emergency medicine. Clinical-scientific cooperation with institutions of the Medical Faculty and the UK RUB in the existing research focus and development areas as well as participation in existing and future collaborative research projects are desired.

Applicants must be able to show evidence of a positively assessed junior professorship, postdoctoral qualification or, alternatively, equivalent academic achievements. In addition to outstanding academic qualifications, a track record of acquiring third-party funding, particular aptitude for academic teaching and willingness to participate in academic self-administration, the following are required:

- proof of particular aptitude for academic teaching and a high level of commitment to teaching
- willingness to engage in interdisciplinary scientific projects
- willingness and proven ability to raise external funds for major research projects
